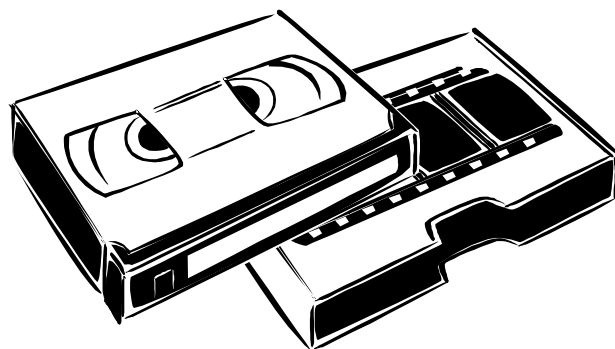

**VIOLENCE PREVENTION: WHAT MIDDLE SCHOOL
TEACHERS AND STUDENTS SHOULD KNOW**

The most urgent problem confronting education today is how to prevent our schools from becoming breeding grounds for violence. This program addresses the problem at the middle school level so that educators, parents, and students can begin to embrace non-violent methods of conflict resolution/crisis intervention at a manageable stage in a child's development.
